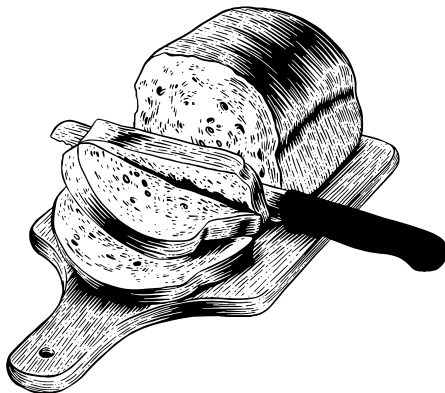

"As iron sharpen iron, so one person sharpens another." (NIV, Pro 27:17)

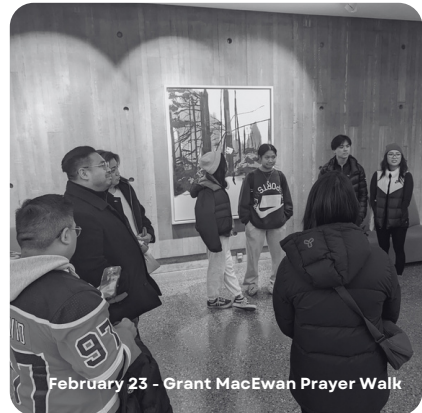

They lead nights of worship, talk about faith and God, and even host outreach nights. Through this club, the Gospel is being preached, students are developing community, and because of the location of the rooms we meet in, our gatherings (with worship and talk of Jesus) are a witness to passerby’s. Often students and faculty either stop to join in or remark at how surprised and pleased they are by what they are seeing and hearing. This year, many seeds were planted and are developing.

A final thing to remember and thank God for from 2023 is “Thankful Thursdays”. A fun, food and friendship filled night for all students hosted at the University of Alberta. With the support of Supper Club, dozens of students enjoyed meals and genuine conversation on



campus. Thankful Thursdays has fostered gratitude and been a reminder of how we are called to be thankful in Scripture (1 Thess 5:16-18.) Thankful Thursdays started (in 2022) meeting the physical need of students for food and also their social need for friendship. **Through the genuine community formed here, spiritual needs are also being met.** During our last Thursday of 2023, several students shared their faith stories and how God has helped them. What a sweet blessing it has been to be part of that.



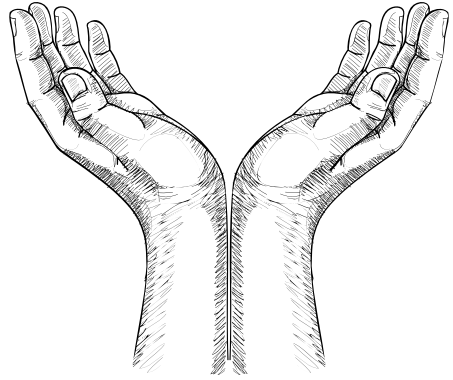

IN my time of need, when I didn't know I needed it, I was prayed for. During a service this past year, Pastor Tony asked the congregation to close their eyes and stand up if we needed prayer. Without understanding why, my body decided I should stand up. I thought, *"well why not? Prayer is always good, and it's anonymous anyways."* Little did I know it was not (anonymous), because seconds later everyone was told to open their eyes. Frozen with fear, I did not know whether I should sit back down or stay standing. Then I was asked to share why I stood up. It hit me: a wave of unforeseen and overwhelming emotion. I was struggling to speak without crying, and all I could manage to say was **"I've been and am being pulled away from God. I need help." I didn't know why I stood up until I was asked. All I knew at that moment was that I needed prayer.**

As soon as others started to pray for me the lump in my throat (that had formed from fighting not to cry) melted away. I no longer felt anxious being out in the open and I was at peace. At that moment, I realized how far I was drifting from God, bottling all of it up, and putting it away to be forgotten.

When I stood up, God showed me that instead of trying to run away from my problems, that in my time(s) of need he would send people willing of journeying with me on my walk with him. The church provided me with the support I didn't know I needed; a space to be open; and safety to talk about my faith and my struggles. I don't remember the words of their prayers, but **what has continued to stay with me is the feeling of warmth and peace of being reintroduced to God's Spirit and His presence.**

I am praying for those in a similar position that I was in, (whether they be Christians who need renewal or those who are seeking to know God) that they will have someone to be there and pray for them too. I'm praying that they have the chance to experience the Holy Spirit and are reminded (or come to know) that He's always there for them wherever they go and however far they may feel. If I happen to be that person who someone asks prayer from, I am praying for God's Word to speak through me as I pray for them so that they can receive what God has for them.

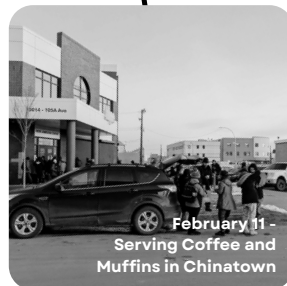

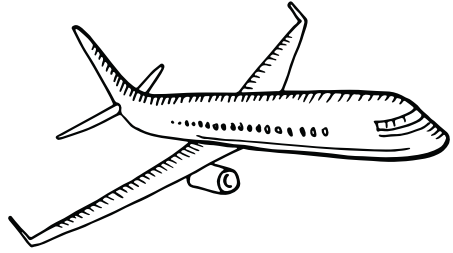

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ELDERS



2023 was a year of taking steps - being able to step out beyond the walls of Supper Club and build relationships with our neighbours both in our city and beyond. We were so blessed and excited to send two teams on mission to the Philippines and Cuba, in addition to sending out our own Pastor on mission (with TWR Canada)!

This year, my wife and I (along with two others) were blessed to be sent by Supper Club as one of those teams. Our trip to Cuba was something new for me in my own personal walk and in my role as an elder. The goal of the trip was to vision cast - essentially to discern "What is God's vision for Supper Club in relation to Cuba?" There, we met local congregations and pastors in Eastern Cuba, established relationships, and discerned possible partnerships between Supper Club and the Church in Cuba. In partnership, we are sending another team to Cuba in 2024.

Our team met with 14 churches over the span of 8 days throughout Eastern Cuba, with most of the churches being in remote and poor areas. We met their local pastors and listened as they shared the trials of being a pastor in these remote areas but also the blessing of being a pastor as they see many coming to know and have a relationship with Jesus.

Praying in Cuba, God lead Kanah and I to meet with a group of university students. Meeting this group of young people with a passion to worship and grow in their relationship with the Lord reminded us of Supper Club because of our own connection with students in Edmonton. Throughout Supper Club's (3 year) history, students have been on our heart to reach, minister to, and serve alongside; from student-led prayer walks around the different schools, to hosting worship nights and developing relationships with International Students.

As I enter into my third year with the Board, I am continuing to pray for more opportunities for us to expand our borders and build Kingdom relationships. I am excited for the next chapter(s) God has in store for Supper Club, our relationships and His partnerships. Let us continue to dream God-sized dreams and clear our hurdles toward the goal of having everyone (not necessarily coming to church) but going out as His Church.

To God be the Glory, great things He has done and is doing and will continue to do!

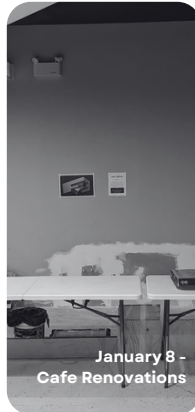

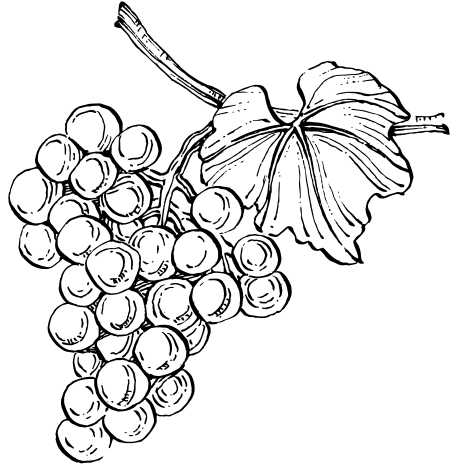

It was a very difficult process to adapt to not doing something, I felt suffocated in the process. But the corporate prayer (which has been a highlight for me) helped me and Angel a lot. We learned the beauty of sharing and praying with one another. Finding, it was a blessing to have others pray for us and a great joy when we were able to pray for others as well! God taught me, once again, the beauty of waiting and surrendering in this place, and we are very glad for the prayer-filled community and meaningful friendships we've experienced.

In early March, I started working at a new place. Before starting, I remember praying, *“God, if you have placed me at this place it is definitely for a reason. Help me be a light to shine your light to those around me through your love, kindness and gentleness.”* After my prayer, my start was very difficult. Every day at the end of the day I felt defeated because of my co-workers. **I had to really ask God for help to love them, as confession and (asking for) prayer every single night became a pattern during our family time.** Sharing and praying during our small group time at Supper Club, God started working in my life in a way

beyond what words can express. At the end of the year, my co-worker came to me and said, *“I really loved working with you. As I transition into another team and we wont be working anymore together, I just want to say I will miss working with you a lot and want you to know that I am talking to you now as a friend.”* This is Proverbs 16:7 come to life, and I am glad God gave me the strength to hold onto him, especially at a time when it did not make sense.

Our life is about sharing the Gospel! We are people of Hope! I pray that we would be able to show Jesus to the destitute and down-trodden this year. 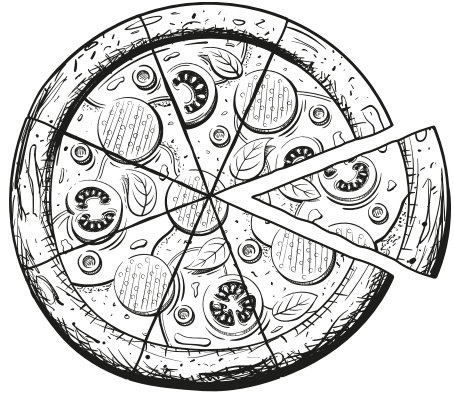

REPORT OF THE LEAD PASTOR

ABIDE, *Witness, Passion, Rediscovering Jesus, Ekklessia, Seek, Friend, and Sent* were the (chronological order of our) teaching themes for our congregation this year. In it, we challenged and encouraged one another to prayerfully ask the Holy Spirit a fundamental question to any who would dare follow Jesus – “*what do you believe God is telling you?*” In other words, “*how (specifically) is he calling you to follow him today?*” While an intense shift for many, our prayer is to see people move from a faith of doing (a religion) to being (in relationship). Being a church (plant), our first instinct can be to organize and instruct people what to do, it is with intentionality that we have empowered people to stop, be still, and take the active step of personally listening and speaking to God (directly). While deliberate and methodical, it has been my joy to see people take steps in confidence and ownership in their faith, wrestling with the profound truth that they can personally walk with Jesus.

This past year, in an effort “*for Supper Club(s) to be integral, impactful, and sustainable in our community*”, we wanted “*to empower people to see our neighbours and neighbourhoods as Jesus does.*” Whether it was sorting non-perishable items at the food bank; cleaning Central McDougall park; bringing coffee and donuts to people experiencing homelessness; preparing and serving spaghetti to



strangers; eating pizza with students; or providing medical and dental services in the Philippines: **100% of our members and regular adherents volunteered to serve their community on at least one occasion in 2023.** In addition, four people led Bible study for the very first time, two people were baptized, and we commissioned (and supported) nine people (including myself) to go on overseas missions. I am incredibly encouraged by the growth of Supper Club as indicated by the impact from their willingness to ‘go’!

In all these activities, we felt a profound call to return to being a people of prayer. To prioritize prayer, our Board cut back on potlucks (to monthly from weekly) and designated the first and third Sundays (before service) for corporate prayer; we reduced online content (i.e. pausing the production of live and service recordings) to website and social media updates only; our book study this summer was Prayer Evangelism by Ed Silvano; we newly prayer walked (and biked) in six Edmonton neighbourhoods; our building hosted a monthly prayer meeting for local pastors; and all of our joint services focused on an invitation for the Church of Edmonton to unite in prayer. This was

highlighted by a **city-wide prayer walk on August 27, where Edmonton congregations and Christians committed to prayer walk in twenty-one different neighbourhoods together**. In another shift, we asked “*why can’t our Sunday service be a prayer meeting?*” To this end, many of our Sundays were used to pray for one another, worldwide events and countries, and even confession. My favorite story in this regard, is how on one Sunday, we invited people to pray corporately through confession. As a pastor, (admittedly) you never know how these will go, but what followed was completely unplanned and awe-inspiring. Everyone voluntarily stayed over an hour after our service had ended to pray as a body. People were kneeling, crying, and one by one the congregation prayed and poured out their hearts to God publicly!

Goal-wise, in 2023 they were (completed in ***bold italics***) to:

- Spring – (1) submit CRA charitable status application; **(2) deploy community prayer walking strategy; (3) complete second phase of construction.**
- Summer – **(4) facilitate multi-church mission, worship, and prayer gathering(s).**
- Fall – (5) launch three neighborhood Supper Clubs (north, south, university); (6) official church launch.

While very thankful for our year, with our organizational value of multiplication, I believe the long-term sustainability of Supper Club will be determined by the ownership and united vision of the congregation. To that end, our focus continues to be on prayer and the health of our spiritual walk(s),

pushing these administrative goals to 2024.

As Supper Club begins its fourth year, it is important to note the partnerships of our congregation. James Law resigned from his position as Pastor for Worship and Creative Engagement in November to focus on Christian content creation, and continues to be a valued member of Supper Club (where he and Emily are part of the worship team). Our membership is eighteen (growth of two this year) and weekly attendance is steady at around thirty. With that, our partnership base is wider. We partner with two local Ethiopian church plants (who use the building weekly), regularly worship with other local congregations, and have seen volunteer partnerships develop across different congregations and missions. Additionally, our prayer and financial partners are not confined to our local congregation or city.

Lastly, with partnership development in mind, (in 2023) we also partnered with PALM Ministry, invited OM’s Stephen Hawkins to lead a seminar on emotional health, and sent mission teams to Cuba and the Philippines. In prayer, Supper Club also commissioned me to serve bivocationally with TWR Canada. ‘Sharing the (pizza) pie together’, Supper Club is truly an example of Kingdom collaboration.

Thank you for your prayerful support in equipping the local and global Church to break bread, give thanks, and do it again!

FINANCIAL REPORT

“HE who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God. For the ministry of this service is not only supplying the needs of the saints but is also overflowing in many thanksgivings to God.” (2 Cor 9:10-12)

In 2023, Supper Club faithfully approved resources designed to “[provide] a clear pathway to empower and equip disciplemakers to grow as leaders”. To this end, with Kingdom partners we were able to surpass our goal of giving \$33k to

missions and outreach this year (an increase of over \$9,000 from 2022).

This year, we also saw completion of phase 3 (and final stage) of our initial building renovations. The community cafe is designed to invite people from outside to inside (the church), and God-willing from the cafe into the sanctuary. One of our first uses of this space was when we provided a meal for our northern neighbours (whom we had never met) displaced by wildfires. We thank the Lord for how every dollar was sown in 2023:

Capital Project (\$33,037):

- Furniture (\$4,984)
- Renovations (\$28,053)

Discipleship and Training (\$5,898):

- Honorarium/Love Gifts (\$3,616)
- Hospitality (\$674)
- Leadership Development (\$1,608)

Missions and Outreach (\$34,001):

- Charitable Giving (\$20,654)
- Outreach (\$13,347)

20 cents from every dollar went to multiplication and discipleship initiatives in 2023.



PRAYING FOR 2024

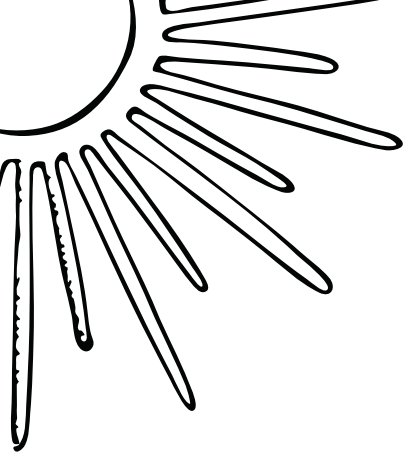

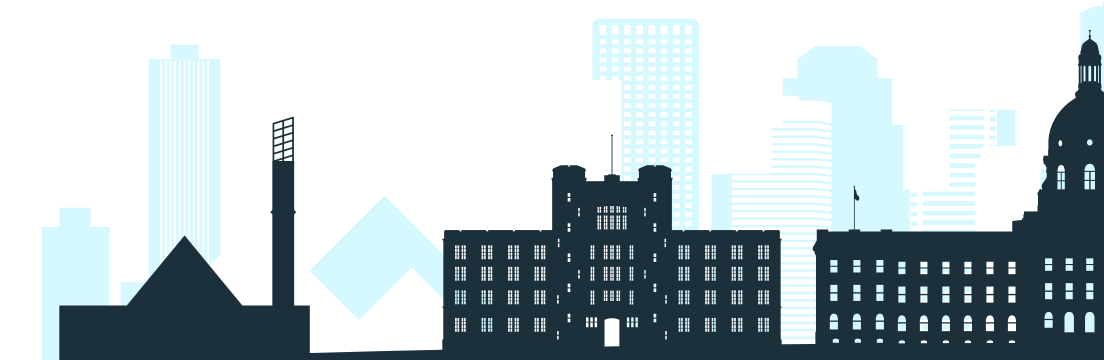

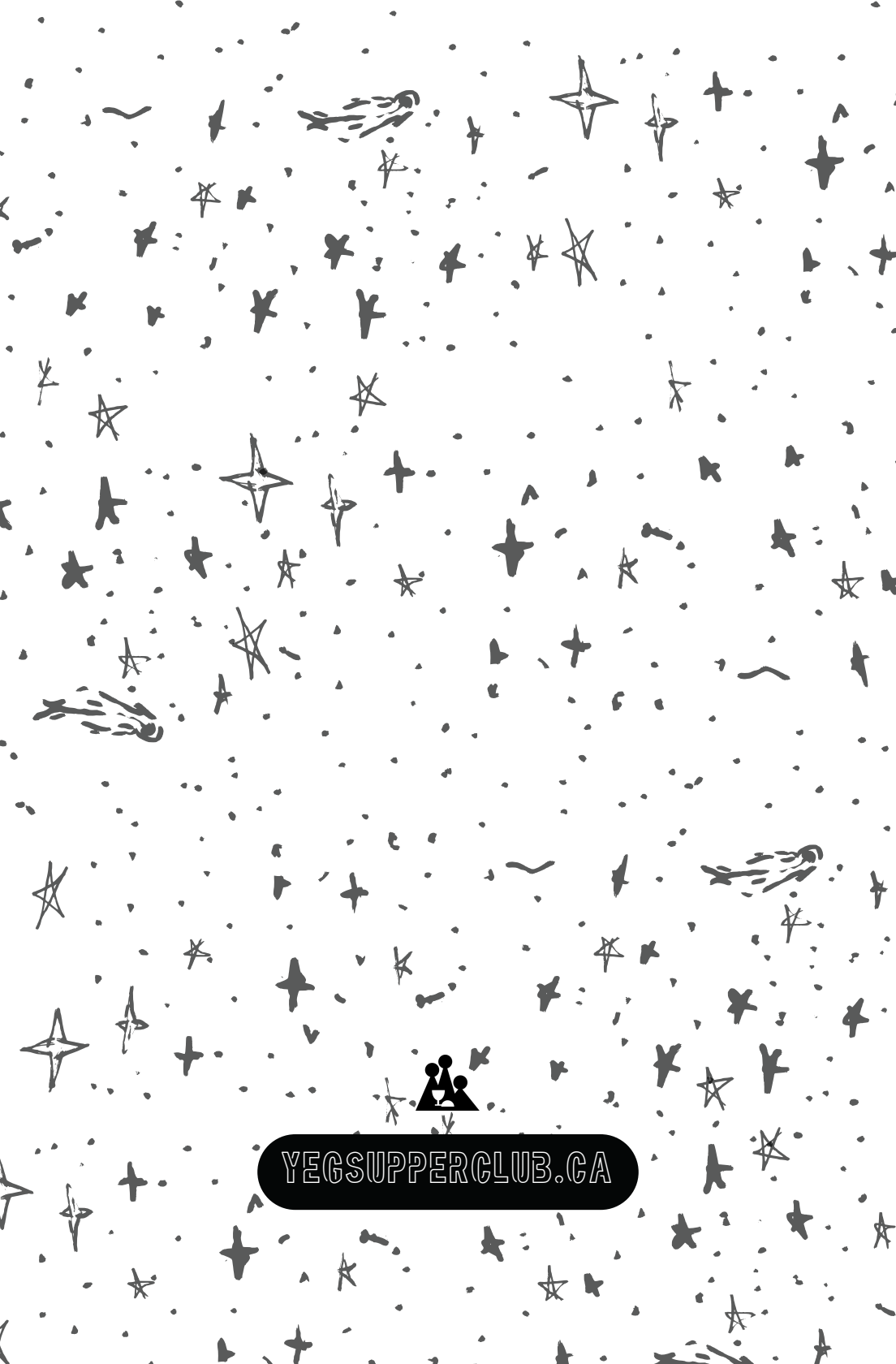
